

Liz was a Fellow of the Royal SA Society of Arts and a member of the Pastel Artists of South Australia. Dear Liz rest in peace.





Jayson has been part of various exhibitions from 2014, in countries such as Singapore, Taiwan, Philippines and Australia. He has received several awards, such as Top 200 Watercolour Artists at the International Watercolour Masters in Shropshire, England, Top 200 Artists at the 2016 Taiwan International Watercolour Competition and Exhibition, Best Promising Young Artist at the South Australia Living Artist (SALA) 2021 and Best Watercolour at Walkerville Art Show 2022.

Facebook Name Change

Dear members.

Although we have had a Facebook presence for some years as "Adelaide Art Society," https://www.facebook.com/
AdelaideArtSociety there has appeared a FaceBook group called the Adelaide Art Society Group, which is a public site which allows anyone to post whatever they choose. A few months ago I was invited by, I don't know who, to be an administrator which I accepted but never really knew what that meant.

As your committee is trying to create a more vibrant online presence we are promoting our FaceBook page which is open, to members' posts only and on which we post the activities of the society and its members and not the activities of other art groups. It is a public page that anyone can view but not post.

At present, this can only be done by sending your post to our Gmail, adelaideartsociety@gmail.com, As soon as we can discover how to invite members who are interested to post themselves we will notify interested members. But for now, I can only promise to post for you. Also, I understand many of you don't have a Facebook presence so this method would suit you.

Our members are interested in what is happening within the society and our FB page is a good way of keeping everyone in the picture.

This is another example of your committee being proactive in an effort to promote our society, its' members and activities including our exhibitions.
