

With Janette Humble, pastel artist

Following an eminent career as a classical musician, Janette Humble discovered the joy of soft pastels ten years ago. Whilst largely self taught she has attended workshops with renowned artists including Everet Ploeg, and master pastelists Tony Alain, Desmond O'Hagen and Grace Paleg.

"I simplify the complexity of my observations into blocks of shapes and values and create depth with multiple layers of colours and textures alongside delicate glazes.

With the bold application of colour,

expressive mark making and a deliberate exploration of composition, I aim to create dynamic paintings infused with movement and energy."

Janette's artistic journey has been recognised with numerous prizes and awards and she is regularly sought after as a solo exhibiting artist with works on permanent display at Art Innova-

tions Gallery, Atelier Crafers gallery, Artworkx and Kruse

Heather Lorenzon, a mixed media artist using acrylic, collage, ink, pastel, oil and jelly-printing

Heather was originally trained as an art teacher at the National Art School in Sydney. Now based in Adelaide for some years, Heather has been an active exhibitor across the state in many galleries and exhibitions. She has had considerable success and been a finalist in the Fleurieu Portrait and Fleurieu Art Prize, Royal SA Society of Arts Portrait Prize, Solar Art Prize and was winner of the Winemakers Prize at the Fleurieu Food and Wine Art Prize 2016 to mention a few.

Heather is a generous teacher willing to share her knowledge and experience. She is often called upon to

give demonstrations or run classes or workshops in mixed media, watercolour or portrait painting.

Heather was a founding member of 'Off the Slate' Gallery, Willunga, a delightful gallery to visit. Heather



has also had art articles published in the Australian Artist Magazine and Dusty Dialogue, the magazine of the Pastel Artists Society of SA. Heather exhibited at Massey Cucina Café at Glenelg during SALA. The works were done within the past two years and displayed Heather's current artistic experimentation with abstract and semi-abstract images. She says, "I have been employing a layering approach starting with having some free-flowing mark-

making fun with various media and tools. Often this free fun will suggest a theme to me, which I develop into more defined images and patterns that seem to support the theme. So the process is a constant discovery and flow of new ideas. I enjoy working in this way as I experience a sense of liveliness, adventure

and spontaneity when doing the work which hopefully communicates itself to the viewer".

LINOCUT WORKSHOP WITH

GAIL KELLETT

SATURDAY 9, SUNDAY 10 NOVEMBER

BIO-I work from home in McLaren Vale on the Fleurieu Peninsula. My ideas reflect the diversity of the region in which I live- rural and urban landscape, native flora and agricultural machinery.



-I find linocut printmaking a powerful medium- exciting and unpredictable. My work is hand drawn straight onto the lino, which gives it freshness, originality and spontaneity.

Design is paramount to my style. I enhance the main image with bold elements in both the foreground and background. When hand-painting I often include large areas of black and white, which strengthen the composition.



When cutting I utilise varying techniques to display texture and create energy. I use water based Block Print Lamp Black Ink. Each piece is individually hand rolled and editions are normally 20 pieces depending on size.

I hand paint usually in sets of 2 - 4. I use acrylic paint to show bold, striking colour. Finally I spray varnish to enhance the colours and protect the Canson-Ja paper.


